Purchasing Buicks Win Hockey Title

THE hardest-fought hockey finals in the history of GM's leagues came to a rousing climax recently when Purchasing Department Buicks edged out Parts and Accessories Pontiacs by a single goal in the last game.

The Pontiac-Buick series required the teams to obtain two out of three games for the championship. Pontiacs won the first game 2-1. Buicks took the second game 4-2.

The third game resulted in a tie of 3-3, making it necessary for a fourth game to be played.

A cleanly-fought contest, this game saw only one goal—by **Bill Pulkalsky**, an alternate for the Buicks. It was scored shortly before half-time. Despite the concerted efforts of the Pontiac players, they were unable to even up the score.

Presentation of the J. B. Highfield Trophy to goal-keeper **Gord Clarke** was made by **Perce Morison**, Purchasing, who acted as league commissioner for the season.

Earlier in the season, the Pontiacs beat out the Cadillacs (Parts and Accessories Stock Room) in three games, losing the first match and winning the following two. The Buicks won their right to compete in the finals when they defeated the Oldsmobiles (Accounts Payable) two straight games.
